From David and Ruth

Greetings from the whole church family of St. James' and St. Peter's. We may not be able to meet together in our church buildings, but we are still the church and we hope this booklet helps you to worship and pray with the rest of the church.

Very few of us have experienced anything like this. For some it is a time of anxiety and fear, others may actually enjoy the enforced solitude and the quietening down of life. Some are finding new ways to stay in touch, to support and be supported; for others it just feels isolating.

The Bible is full of people who are thrown into crisis, or into isolation. Noah is shut up in his boathouse for 13 months before he can go outside again.

Abraham leaves his familiar home and sets out with the bare minimum of possessions and family, not knowing where he'll end up.

Elijah heads off alone to the mountain to seek God.

Jesus is (to literally translate the original language) 'thrown' into the desert by the Holy Spirit for 40 days.

After the initial shock (and perhaps sense of adventure), each of these has to deal with the daily grind of waiting, learning what to do with their isolation, discovering new things about themselves and God.

And at the end? Noah receives a rainbow and a promise, Abraham a new land, Elijah hears the gentle whisper of God's voice, Jesus returns from the desert in the power of the Holy Spirit.

May God be with you during this strange and difficult time. Don't be afraid to reach out to others in the church: as the song says 'we are here to help each other/walk the mile and bear the load'.

With our prayers, may God bless you and watch over you.


